Scott Kowalkowski returns home in triumph. The junior defensive even makes a shambles of University of Michigan's offensive line, sacking the quarterback a half-dozen times, failing on a fumble or two, dumpling a running back on his tail in his own end zone for a safety.

And his Notro Dame team holds onto its top ranking in the national polis with a convincing win over U-M.

As any Wolverine fan now knows — at least any fan who entertained visions quite opposite of the aforementioned — dreams don't always come true.

Kowalkowski's didn't. He didn't get a half-dozen sacks or a safety. Heck, he didn't even get to play defensive end.



WHEREVER HE plays — and Kowalkowski isn't even sure where they might be — he knows he has to hustle. Which brings us back to the fumble recovery.


