There are several different types of seams used to trick business employees into either giving back too much change for purchases, or giving too much change for larger bills.

If this all sounds confusing, it is meant to. That's what the bad guy wants to create – confusion. If this can be accomplished, then his trick will most often be successful.

himself as a customer will pur-chase an inexpensive item and pay for it with a \$5, \$10 or \$20 bill. Somewhere during the transac-tion, the person will ask for the original bill back and give the clerk a different bill for the purchase. This becomes confusing and the clerk is tricked into giving the per-sent to much charge.

ciers is tricked into giving the per-son too much change.

In most cases, the bad guy gets not only change, but the actual bill first given to the clerk. The goal of this seam is to create as much con-fusion and obtain as much money as possible, thereby making the clerk feel sullty. clerk feel guilty.

Victims of these type scams should report them to the police department. Should an employee become involved in what they believe is one of these scams, they should stop the transaction and advise the customer that the police will be called to come and assist.


