

## Odyssey of Mind meeting at Dunckel

All Farmington-area parents and students interested in school enrichment are encouraged to attend a meeting tonight on the Odyssey of the Mind program.

Formerly called OM, it's a creative problem-solving program done throughout the world and sponsored by the Farmington Public Schools locally.

It is available currently sponsored by the district's DELTA Department, but a student need not be enrolled in the DELTA program to participate. Private schools in the area have also participated in past years.

A one-hour information session for parents and students is at 7:30 p.m. this evening at O.E. Dunckel Middle School. The session will give an introduction to the Odyssey of the Mind program.

This national effort provides teams of students in all grades with technical or fine arts team challenges that will test their thinking, teach cooperative abilities and help develop creative skills. The Odyssey of the Mind program has teams participate from 45 states, Canada, Mexico, China, England, Japan and the Soviet Union.

## Pair rob man, steal his van at car wash

A Livonia man washing his van at a Farmington Hills carwash had the vehicle, as well as his wallet and checkbook, taken at gunpoint by two men shortly past midnight Thursday.

Moments before, the two men had been dropped off by a third man, who left before the robbery.

The 34-year-old victim was not hurt in the 12:05 a.m. stickup at the Farmington Carwash, Eight Mile and Pearl. Taken were his 1989 Chrysler Voyager van, his wallet containing \$13 and his checkbook.

According to Farmington Hills police:

The victim was washing his van in a western bay when he saw a gray car drive slowly through the wash lot. When he walked from the bay, the victim saw a shadow, then saw a man walk toward him.

Scared, he went back to his van, where he was confronted by two men who had come from the rear of the van.

One of the men put a gun to the victim's head and demanded his keys. The victim was then shoved to the ground. His wallet and checkbook were taken from his pockets.

When the gunman threatened to "blow your head off," the victim turned over his keys.

The robbers, thought to be in their 20s, then jumped in the van and went east on Eight Mile.

The gun was described as a chrome revolver with a 2-inch-long barrel.

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ler-driven de Havilland DHC-6 Twin Otter, manufactured in Canada, carried 19 passengers and crashed at 9:53 a.m. mountain daylight time.

rar said. "Every seat is a window seat."

It may take the National Transportation Safety Board up to a year to determine the cause of crash, he said. They dispatched a 10-member team for crash investigation.

"We're in the early stages of fact-

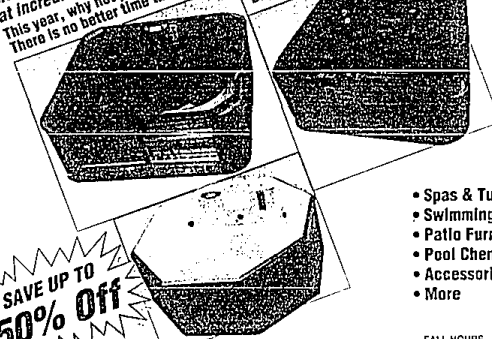
finding," said Mike Benson, a member of the investigation team. "We're documenting the crash site, inside of the fuselage, packing the engines and sending them down to the manufacturer, developing a layout and conducting interviews. Some passengers said they saw the pilots reach

for levers above them, when a red light came on and the alarm went off. It (the plane) touched down briefly (on the runway)."

The plane veered left, landing on its left side. "It appeared that the people who died were seated on the left side," he said.
