## Jewish survey planned

Farmington-area residents will participate in the first survey of the Jewish population of metropolitan Detroit in nearly five decades. Sponsored by the Jewish Welfare Federation of Detroit, the survey will be directed by researchers Dr. Steven Cohen and Dr. Jacob Ukles of New York. Market Opinion Research of Detroit will conduct the telephone interviews.

The first set of results, expected by January, will directly influence short- and long-range planning, development and delivery of services and programs for the community.

Similar studies conducted by other Jewish federations have led to improved community services.

Federation's survey committee, under the leadership of Stuart Hertzberg, believes Detroit's study will prove equally beneficial.

A total of 1,000 telephone interviews will be conducted from mid-October to mid-November using two approaches. The first is random digit dialing, in which profes-

sional interviewers dial a series of randomly selected telephone numbers. The other method will entail a random selection of names from the existing lists of Jewish households provided by the federation.

Anonymity of respondents will be maintained, and the information will not be used for solicitation purposes, Hertzberg said.

As the findings are analyzed, published reports will be shared with the community.
