The solution is used to sanitize dairy equipment in preparation for milk production and is normally packaged in milk cartons that are set aside to be dumped before production begins, McCarthys, and duction begins, McCarthys, and addry in Livonia when workers mistakenly loaded cartons containing the solution onto a milk truck, according to McCarthy. "The mistake was made to put these cartons in the same routing as the product when they should have been taken to the dump," McCarthy said.

Atthough chlorine solution occa-sionally appears in dairy products, it doesn't often happen in as high con-centrations, McCarthy said. "The product is in our lab right now and we are examining it," he said.

ROGER SPOKESMAN Ray Reed said he didn't know how the mix-up at the dairy occurred. "Obviously, we are going to take a scrious look at (the production process)," he said. Customers who may have bought the product should return it to a Kroger store for a refund. A woman called West Bloomfield police Thursday after she discovered that a milk carron she had bought at the Kroger store in the Cross Winds Mail on Orband Lake Road contained the chlorine solution. Police Sgt. Mike Madigan said although the woman bought the carton on Oct. 13, she didn't open it until Thursday. She called police after returning the product to the store, Madigan said.
