Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

- DIMITRI'S REOPENS**
 Six days after an accidental kitchen fire prompted the evacuation of diners and employees, Dimitri's restaurant in downtown Farmington reopened for breakfast Tuesday.
 Hosts Susan and Angela Anastasio report that Dimitri's sports a freshly repaired, scrubbed and painted interior.
 The restaurant, 32200 Grand River, was filled at the time the fire was reported, 1:25 p.m. Oct. 11.
- BUILDING FIRE**
 A pre-dawn fire was confined to the second-floor office of Rashid Construction in the Bloomfield Outdoors building on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills, Oct. 14.
 "The fire department did a real good job in saving the building," said Jeff Murphy, a mechanic at Bloomfield Outdoors, 32105 Northwestern Highway, south of 14 Mile.
 The cause of the fire continues to be investigated, said Al Ellis, Farmington Hills fire investigator.
 Highways resident Terry Hamilton said his father smelled smoke, then saw flames on the south side of the building about 2:45 a.m.
 Rashid Construction's second-floor office sustained smoke, heat and flame damage, Ellis said.
 The first-floor showroom for Bloomfield Outdoors — filled with displays of lawnmowers, bicycles and guns — sustained light water and smoke damage.
 The fire was under control within 30 minutes, Ellis said.
- SHOTGUN TAKEN**
 A shotgun was taken in a burglary of a house on Averhill Tuesday night.
 According to Farmington Hills police:
 When the homeowner arrived home at 8 p.m., he found an entry door kicked open, then found the sliding door ajar.
 In the back yard, he encountered a
- man who said he had lost his dog. The homeowner grabbed the man, but the man broke free and ran.
 The homeowner found several of his guns in the back yard, but the shotgun was missing.

 A club-wielding man threatened a 23-year-old Farmington Hills woman in a traffic altercation at Farmington Road and 12 Mile Tuesday afternoon.

Chlorine found in milk

The solution is used to sanitize dairy equipment in preparation for milk production and is normally packaged in milk cartons that are set aside to be dumped before production begins, McCarthy said.
 The contamination occurred recently at a dairy in Livonia when workers mistakenly loaded cartons containing the solution onto a milk truck, according to McCarthy.
 "The mistake was made to put these cartons in the same routing as the product when they should have been taken to the dump," McCarthy said.
 Although chlorine solution occasionally appears in dairy products, it doesn't often happen in its high concentrations, McCarthy said.
 "The product is in our lab right now and we are examining it," he said.

Murphy said she has received many offers contingent to rezoning, 27 in all. There are two solid offers, she said.
 HURD SHOULD have guessed that the city hall property across the street would have been further developed, said Sandy McKelley, Pasadena Park Homeowners Association secretary. Further office space isn't needed in the area because there already is other office space available for lease, she said.
 McKelley voted concern about spot rezoning. She felt Hurd may be

asking too much for the property.
 "I'm disappointed," Hurd said. "We're re-checking some legal technicalities and options. We're not sure which way we will go. It's an attempt to preserve the status quo."
 The city council has ultimate say over the rezoning request. It will consider the request Monday, Nov. 20.
