
Municipal, zero-coupon bonds will help education

Zero-coupon bonds are another op-tion. You could huy a \$1,000 high-quality 18-year municipal zero-coupon bond paying 7% percent for approximately \$295. If you bought several of those bonds for each child each year for four years, you would

be providing a nice fund.
Another gift that would not result
in any current tax would be U.S. Savings Bonds. As long as these bonds
are held five years or more, they pay
6 percent, and the interest isn't taxable until the bonds are redeemed.

ONCE A chill has reached 14 and Income is taxed at the child's rate, you may want to give higher-yielding investments. Stocks that have appreciated in value may be given. If the child sells them, the capital gains tax will be at a lower rate, and the money can be reinvested.

Once the child is 14, if the tax on your income is 33 percent and his is in the bottom bracket, the total tax paid will be less if the money is

transferred to the child rather than kept in your bands.




