Proposal A calls for a half cent sales tax increase to benefit school financing. Finangan sale Proposal A would change the financial picture for some districts, but would leave Farmington out-of-formula and give Farmington out-of-formula and give he district no additional money.

Proposal B is more complicated, it asks for a two-cent sales tax increase and offers some property tax relief. "We have one set of figures . . . show us losing money and another set showing us marking money," he said. "The concept of B is just confusing."
