Let the traveling consumer beware

It's still consumer beware in the travel business.

Greater consumer awareness is necessary when dealing with travel industry agents, said state Rep. Linda Miller, R-Birmingham, after an unsuccessful attempt to get a state law to protect travelers when a travel agency goes out of business.

Miller introduced her legislation in the wake of the abrupt closing of a Lathrup Village travel agency, to which area residents and groups

had paid money to book travel. She wanted to protect other travelers' investments by requiring agents and tour operators to establish escrow accounts or purchase special insurance.

"I met extensively with House members, state officials and travel industry representatives to discuss not only my bills, but legislation to license travel agents," she said. "However, the involved parties could not reach agreement on the bills."

"PROSPECTIVE TRAVELERS should work only with travel agents who are members of the American Traveler Corporation or travel operators who offer association protection plans. Reputable agents and operators concerned about maintaining their integrity will make every attempt to assure pre-paid travel arrangements are honored."
