ROGERS SAID that this has been a busy year for weather "One reason it is tough to foreast snow, especially at this time of year, is that there is still a lot of moisture and the temperature is still warm, not only here on the ground but in he mid-levels of the atmosphere, 1,500 feet. It's tough to pinpoint what's going to fall as rain and changeover to snow." Rogers said that all TV stations use the same kind of computer analysis. Differences among them when it comes to weather forecasts are based on Interpretation. Twenty-four-hour forecasts are 85-90 per-


