Here's how Observer & Eccentric area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes in the week ending Nov. 10.

HOUSE

TO RAISE DEBT CEILING; By a vote of 299 for and 99 against, the House gave final congressional approval of legislation (II) Res 280) raising the public debt limit from 12.8 trillion to \$3.12 trillion. The new ceiling is expected to bold unit October 1990, when the government likely will need additional borrowing authority to avoid default. The bill also repealed the disputed "Section 99" tax provision that has kept employers from deducting fringe benefits that are provided only to selected employers.

Supporter Bill Archer, R-Tex, sald 'na unpalatable as raising the ded innti might be, the dinancial security of the nation must reterrite our relucance" to do. No member spoke against the resolution during brief floor debate.

Members voting yes wanted to raise the public debt celling.

TO APPROVE DEFENSE BUDGET: By a vote of 236 for and 172 against, the House aproved the company of the properties of the IEEE Company of the Pentagen budget adjusted for inflation has declined. The Senate was expected to send the legislation to President Bush.
