

Studio on wheels ready to roll

As a graduate of our community television workshops, are you aware that you have another production option available to you? The mobile television van is available to the residents, to use.

Yes, it is the intention of both the MetroVision and SWOC to encourage maximum use of the mobile production van by qualified producers. This will increase the quantity and quality of community access programming for our cities.

Van use policies have been incorporated into our overall community access policies:

- Submit a written proposal of use several weeks prior to the event.
- Secure location releases to ensure that your location hosts understand that parking for a van must be permitted. Include a detailed copy of your script.

- Technical considerations are detailed in the policy for power supplies, set up time and weather conditions.

- The crew certified on the van will be your volunteer crew. This is your responsibility to sign up fellow workshop graduates. MetroVision will provide you with a list of those folks who have learned of the van set up. If you prefer to have your regular crew, then establish a workshop with MetroVision staff on the van set up to suit your particular needs. The number of crew will consist of 5-7 crew members.

The kinds of productions for which the van will be used include shows of at least 30 minutes in length and those which desire a completely edited product by the end of the shoot.
