### DEAN'S LIST

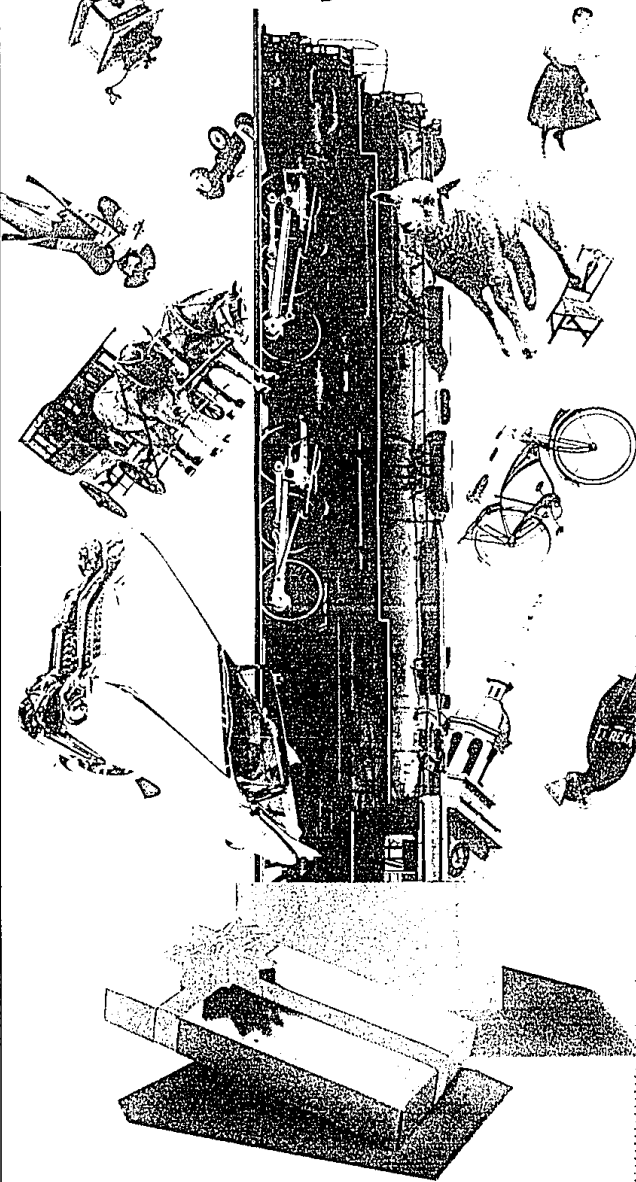
Kenneth Lipka of Farmington Hills was named to the dean's list at Ohio Northern University. He is a junior majoring in mechanical engineering.
