Shasky adjusts to college game

Jennifer Shasky hasn't experienced "All-Nighter" yet at George Washington University, but with this being finals week, she is prepared for one.

"I was up till 3:30 last night (Monday) studying for my 'Old Testament' exam," said Shasky, a freshman basketball player from Birmingham, Marian. "That's an 'All-Nighter' for me. My brain is pretty fried right now."

So far, academics have been a greater challenge for Shasky, a fine addition to the Colonials' women's basketball team.

Shasky, last year's Miss Basketball winner, twice has been named the Atlantic 10 Conference Rookie of the Week. That's quite an honor, considering the season is less than a month old.

A starter at small forward, Shasky is averaging 11.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game for the 4-1 Colonials. She is making 48 percent of her 3-point field goals (12 of 25) and is shooting 43 percent overall from the floor.
