The Michigan Constitution, passed in 1963, required 132 existing state agencies to be consolidated into 20 departments.

The Legislature promptly created 19 departments but reserved one opening for future needs. Dozens of ideas have been floated in the last 25 years, but none has developed the broad political support that a "Chil-dren and Family Srvices Agency" is receiving.




