

A high school administrator from the Ypsilanti school district was ap-pointed Tuesday night as the new principal at North Farmington High School.

Deborah Tenjeras Clarke, Farmington Public Schools' first female high school principal, is now an assistant principal at Ypsilanti High School. At North, she will replace Don Cowan, who moves to the central office to handle administrative and operation functions.

Although saying the appointment was an important step in giving young women in high school a key role model, superintendent Michael Flanagan stressed that Clarke is the best person for this job. Not the best woman — the best person."

"This is one of the most important appointments we will make in this district." he added. "I can't think of a more difficult job, including mown, than that of high school principal:

THE NEW principal was introduced at a special board meeting held before the regular meeting Tuesday night, where trustees asked her questions, then officially appointed during the regular board session.
