# District steps up plans for elementary school

Burgeoning enrollment has prompted Walted Lake school officials to proceed one year early on plans for yet another new elementary school. The school is expected to open in [all 1991, one year after the new Pleasant Lake Elementary School now under construction on Halsted Hoad south of Pontlac Trail.

"It's clear that we will need that

building in 1991," district spokes-woman Lois Lange said.
Plans to move the second new ele-mentary school ahead of schedule were approved Dec. 14 in a unanl-mous vote by five members of the Walled Lake Board of Education.

The district includes northwest Farmington Hills.

The new elementaries are part of a massive construction plan that school district voters approved last March, when they passed a \$47.8 million bond issue.

THIS LATEST move is not expect-ed to force the school board to seek a millage increase beyond the three-mill level that voters had been told to expect, Lange said.

The two schools will bring to 13 the number of elementaries in the Walted Lake Consolidated School District, which is experiencing tremendous growth. The district serves nine Lakes Area communities.
