Detroit Cover-Up's Learning Center for Homeless Women and Children, the Blanket Lady's Place, is concrete proof of Darlene Feld-man's commitment to the poor. The non-profit center, at 3752 Cass in Detroit's Cass Corridor, is just a shell now. But in about a month, it will be a hub where the bands of volunteers will sneed out

Feldman, a Farmington Hills single mother of two, who has earned her title of the Blanket Lady in metro Detroit, is taking her hands-on crusade one step fur-ther by transforming a rundown former car dealership into a day-time activity center for women and children. It will not he a funchanse It will not be a flophouse. "Kids are my pareler hands of volunteers will spread out like tentacles to tackle the femin-

"Kids are my passion," said Feldman, 39. "That's where I feel there is a need. Women and chil-

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dren have to be lifted out of pover-ty. Women's needs are different. Almost every shelter is exclusively for men. There's a lot of harass-ment and sexual abuse. "It will not be a warming place. This is an activity program with job training, substance abuse gui-dance and motivational speakers."

THE PROGRAM is built on a prototype of a similar center called Dignity House in Philadelphia. Feldman stresses that women

Robert Paul Laurin, 23, of Farmington Hills

faces charges of possessing a loaded firearm in or upon a vehicle in a non-game area, a two-year misdemeanor, reckless use of a firearm, a 90-day misdemeanor, and illegal entry, a 90-day misdemeanor.

He pleaded not guilty at his arraignment Tuesday before Magistrate James Brady of Farmington. Bond was set at \$2,500.
