Members believe high absentee-ism from roll calls is politically harmful, particularly when an ag-gressive challenger converts the tru-ancy into a campaign Issue easily comprehended by woters back home. But there is no widely held view that high attendance translates automati-cally into excellence in other con-gressional tasks.

REPRESENTATIVES LIKE WII-REPRESENTATIVES LIKE William Natcher, D-Ky, who has never missed a floor vote in 35 years in the flouse, and Charles Bennett, D-Fla., who has missed just one quorum call since 1951, are rated by colleagues as effective legislators, as are many other members with sparkling attendance.

But the fact that many unexceptional lawmakers also have high attendance bolsters the view that merely showing up to vote has little bearing on overall competence.

"Voting participation is not a good indicator of anything other than someone's determination not to miss votes," said Thomas Mann, a Congress-wateher for the Brookings Institution.

"Standing alone, it doesn't mean that much," said Heritage Foundain congressional specialist Mark Liedl, "because it is not that difficult to




