Organist spreads enthusiasm for the 'King of Instruments'

The pipe organ — everyone has heard one and, perhaps, marvelled at the variety of sounds it can produce. Now comes a rare opportunity to take a closer look at this "King of Instruments" in a way that is both entertaining and informative.

Nardin Park Methodist Church presents CJ Sambach in a program entitled "The Organ Presentation" as the next event in the church's Music Series. Sambach is a dynamic speaker, and his own enthusiasm and love of the organ spreads to those who hear him.

The public is invited to attend "The Organ Presentation" which will begin at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 8, in the sanctuary of Nardin Park Church, 29887 11 Mile, just west of Middlebelt. There is no admission charge for the program, and no offering will be taken.

Children, youth, and adults will find this to be a fascinating presentation and a truly enjoyable way of learning more about the magnificent instrument.

Sambach is a resident of Brick, N.J., and is a graduate of Westmin-

ster Choir College. He has led many workshops in basic organ applications, works as a consultant to churches considering new organ installation, and often plays at dedicatory recitals. His greatest happiness comes, however, from seeing others become excited and involved with the instrument that he himself deeply loves.

For this reason, he has traveled the country, explaining and demonstrating the wonders of the pipe organ.

The presentation is made in such a way that it captivates children as young as 6 years old and yet is thoroughly enjoyed by adults.

Fine organ literature is a part of Sambach's program, and he features works by such well-known composers as Soler, Gigout, and Schumann. Each piece has been chosen to highlight different stops that an organist might use and, after having heard his explanations, the audience can appreciate the variety of sounds even more.
