Winning time was more than just a cute phrase for the Livonia Franklin basketball team Tuesday

Writing time. We are the last team Teesday night.

"I said: "It's winning time, let's put it to a higher level," Franklin coach flod Hann told his players. "Exerything below five minutes we call winning time, tong gotta, mentally, get tougher.

"We had the lead, and we wanted them to play man defense. That's a chance you take I'p your kids get fouled—that they'll make the free throws, but we expect them to deliver in those situations."


