Credit union looks to its past — and future

From a meeting in 1950 at the old Farmington High School — and with a little livestment of only \$1,000 and the former Farmington Teachers Federal Credit Union was born. Today, after several name changes and the addition of other school districts, eities and businesses, the LOC Federal Credit Union beasts 10,400 members, assets of more than \$32 million and a new facility.

THE CREDIT union's new 18,000-square-foot, \$1.9-million headquar-ters on Farmington Road in down-hown Farmington was dedicated on Monday, complete with ribbon-cut-ting ecremony and reception. It boasts an automatic teller, night drop, drive-through teller windows and expanded space for the growing business.

LOC board president Landon Swanson, a teacher with the Farmington Public Schools, sald the credit union's business has grown consistently by 30 percent each year in recent times.

Some highlights of the past 40 years include:

• 1950s - 10 employees of Farmington Public Schools begin a credit unior for district employees. The first ioan was for \$200. Clarenceville school employees were soon added, making the name the Farmington-Clarenceville Teachers Federal Credit Union. Also invited to be members were the cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills, John Wesley College, South Live of \$1960s - the first main office was built on laberty Street.

■ 1960s — the first main office was built on Liberty Street.

• 1970s — Howell and Hartland school districts join the credit union, changing the name to Western Oakland County Federal Credit Union. As other Livingston County district joined, the name changed again to Livingston-Oakland Counties Federal Credit Union. A branch office was opened in Howell in 1975.

• 1930s — employees of the Farmington-Farmington Hills and Nevi chambers of commerce were offered membership. With expanded membership, the ceredit union board purchased land in 1937, broke ground for a new headquarters in 1986 and opened last fall.

The name was recently changed to LOC Federal Credit Union. The two-acre parcel on which the new building sits was sold to the credit union in 1987 by the city of Farmington.
