## County eyes "dope money" for car phones

As the war on crime becomes in-creasingly high teeb, police agencies in Oakland County continue to have an advantage: They can spend the bad guys' money. A practical example of that ad-vantage was scheduled to come to the attention of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners today when the prosecutor's office asks for au-

thorization to buy six car phones.

The car phones are needed so investigators can communicate with each other more readily, according to Gerald D. Poisson, Oakland County chief assistant prosecutor.

Police radios aren't adequate, or private enough, Polsson told mem-bers of the board's finance commit-tee last week. So the prosecutor's office wants authorization for six car phones that can easily be trans-

ferred from car to car.

"It won't cost taxpayer money,"
Poisson said, because the prosecutor's office, or other police agencies,
can frequently get car phones — or
money to buy them — when they
seize property in drug raids.

THE FINANCE COMMITTEE THE FINANCE COMMITTEE unanimously approved the request and referred it to today's board meeting where it is expected to be approved.

The price is right, said Commissioner Donald W. Jensen, R. Birmingham. "It's a logical use of resources."

Commissioner James D. Ferrens, D-Pontlae, noted that in many incidents, crooks — or people accused of crimes — already have car phones.

"And I like using the dopers' money," said Ferrens, a Pontlar police officer, referring to using confiscated money to buy phones and pay the monthly usage bills.

Polsson said the cost of the car phones is about \$3,500. Tax money will not be used, he said, because money is available from the pool of cash selred in drug raids.

Expenditures from that pool are monitored by a circuit judge, But approval from commissioners is needed before the judge will approve buying the car phones or other equipment, he explained.

Poisson said other police units — specifically the Rochester Hills contingent of the Oakland County Sher-life's Department — already use car

phones, "with good results."
Asked about car phones, Lt. Jerry Carlin, commander of the Rochester Hills police, said, "I can't say enough good things about them."

good things about them."

Carlin cited the investigation into kidnap-murder of Wanda and Glenn Tarr last November as an example of how car phones are useful. "We were able to team up federal investigators with our detectives and trace more leads," Carlin sald. "We couldn't do that with normal police radio frequencies."

radio frequencies."

ALSO USING CAR phones, investigators were able to set up a cotomand post inside the Tarr residence without tying up the housebold lines. "We wanted the house phones upon for a possible ransom demand," he said.

One problem with car radios, Carlins said, is that all too often criminals — and the media — have scanners that enable them to monitor law police communications. Mindful that conversations on a car phone can be monitored, Carlin said, "Car phones are not completely private. But they're more private than police radios."

Carlin said investigators used car phones — rather than radios — when they eventually found the bodies of Glenn and Wanda Tarr in Pontiac.

"Il we had used the car radio, we would have had television news crews at the scene before our investigators could do their job," he said.

Carlin said Rochester Hills pur-chased six car phones — and pays their monthly phone bills, about \$500 — from the regular police budget.

It's a good expenditure for police, Carlin said, "Car phones help indi-vidual detectives become more pro-ductive."


