## Delivery man alerts family to fire

Tuesday night proved one of the more exciting nights in Stace Mul-lins' job as a delivery man for Domi-no's Pizza. He found himself climb-

nos Pizza. He found himself climb-ing on the roof of a new cluster bome, trying to extinguish a chim-ney fire.

"By far, it was an exciting night," the Farmington Hills resident said.
"I thought, 'Maybe I should become a firedighter,' I never thought about that until last night,"

A couple with a small child lives in the home, but no one was hurt in the 10 pm. fire, which broke out on the 3650 block of Bingham Court at the 1650 block of Bingham Court at velopment, north of Grand River, west of Drake.

"It was a quickly spreading fire that caused an early collapse of the roof into the great room." Farmington Hills Depty Fire Chief Peter Baldwin said.
The fire left an estimated standard.

The fire left an estimated \$100,000 in structural damage to the two-story-home, part of a new three-unit building at Drakes Crossing. Content damage was estimated at \$10,000.

"Most of the contents is salvage—able." Baldwin said.

MULLINS, WHO delivers for Domino's Pizza, 31605 Grand River, in Farmington, had just made a de-livery about 10 p.m. at the nearby Chatham Hills Apartments when he noticed an unusual amount of smoke coming from the chimney of a home

The 21-year-old quickly found the burning home and alerted the residents their chimney was on fire. "It looked like there was too much smoke coming out. I went around the house and saw flames coming out of the chimney," Mullins said. "I knocked on the guy's door and said, 'Your house is on fire.' My main concern was that the guy was awake."

While the homeowner called 91-11 and assured that his family was sale, Mullins, a two-year veteran driver, put his safety training to work. He climbed to the roof with a portable extinguisher to dampen the flames. The fire, however, spread quickly from the chimney to the attic above the great room. It took 30 fire-flighters about 20 minutes to extinguish the blaze. There was smoke damage throughout, Baddwin said. "Working gives me the apportunity to be the eyes and ears for our neighborhood. I'm glad I could help him mestigators revisited the scene Wednesday to try to pinpoin what caused the fire. They suspect a possible fireplace design defect. They said the fireplace had been serviced

for a drafting problem earlier that day.


