

# Investing risk can be reduced with balance and good advice

In the current turbulent econosys

In the current turbulent econosys-tem, there appears to be an ever-in-creasing risk associated with invest-ment.

And yet, there is no choice but to assume investment risk if you wish to earn more than bank savings re-

to earn more than bonn of the possibility of a loss in an investment with the certainty of loss in a bank account: If inflation is running at 6 percent, and your savings are earning 5½ percent, you are losing money.

THIS IS not to downplay either liquidity or safety. Part of your money should be in safe investments, for on one knows how more-riskly investments will turn out. Part of your money should be in a saving account or money market fund, because no one knows when you will need eash to handle unforeseen problems or unexpected opportunities.

Fortunately, while there is risk, there is also diversification. By dividing your assets among a variety of complementary investments, you

can significantly out your risk while (frequently) increasing your rate of return.

EXAMPLES OF complementary investments include U.S. stocks, long-term bonds, foreign stocks, real estate and cash. Other investments, such as annuities, can be added to the list.

The accompanying chart indicates how various mixes might be altered to increase return as economic conditions change.

However, a word of caution is in order.

Portfolio management is difficult and not for everyone. It is wise to

seek expert help. A competent finan-cial planner, a portfolio manager, a bank trust department or profession-al financial management team should be able to help you achieve your investment goals.


