Take precautions to prevent burns

Burns are a major cause of injury in children under 5 years of age.

During National Burn Awareness Week, Feb. 4-10, the burn center of Children's Hospital of Michigan offers these safety tips to parents:

- Always supervise your children; know where they are and what they are doing.

- Place a small slide-bolt latch on the upper half of your bathroom door.

- Lower your water heater to 125 degrees or less.

- Always test the temperatures of the bath water. Move your hand with opened fingers through the water for several seconds before placing your child in the bathtub.

- Always run cold water in the bathtub first.

- Face your child away from the faucets and keep them closer to the other end of the tub.

- Give the child a washcloth instead of a toy; toys establish the tub

and bathroom as a play area.

- Keep children at a safe distance while drinking or pouring hot liquids.

- Test all hot food and drinks before giving to children.

- Keep all hot items near the center of the table and avoid use of table cloths and mats.

- While cooking, keep young children at a safe distance from hot surfaces, hot liquids and kitchen hazards — a high chair or playpen is a good idea.

- Keep appliance cords away from the edge of counters and keep them unplugged and disconnected when not in use.

- Keep pot handles turned in so the pots cannot be pulled off or knocked off the stove.

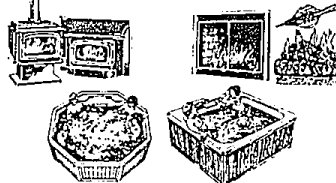
- Designate the front area of your stove as the "no zone."
