School tops county in Easter Seal effort

Preschoolers at Farmington Community School raised \$3,200 for the Easter Seal Society by participating in the Easter Seal Hop-N-HNG at the school recently, topping fund-raising efforts throughout Oakland County.

Preschool teacher Cherie Deltose foglia, 4, and Joshua Buckner. 5, were asked to popear on the Channel 4 Easter Seal Telethon which will be televised March 3-4.

Deflose organized the event as an opportunity to help young children develop and understanding of disabilities at an early age and to foster a positive community spirit. Early in January, the children attended a program about disabilities. The Easter Seal representative who pre-

sented the program brought along medical equipment which the children were able to use. Participating in HOP-N-IMG completed the experience.

Children who participated collected pledges from friends and relatives and took part in a three-minute "hop." Parent volunteers counted the hops and also sent cookies for the participants.

Last year in Oakland County, 1,900 children participated in the program and raised more than \$18,000 for Easter Seals. The money caised by the children at Farmington Community School this year was the most raised by any other preschool or elementary school in Oakland County.


