NOW, HE ALSO caters to college groups, on and off campus, substitut-ing lyries for an alma mater shouted from the crowd, often poking fun at the school's stereotype, Ridley also takes requests, and is surprised at

selections like Jim Croce and James Taylor.

"College crowds are so into the things now that I was into," he said. Rudley wants to shift his act exclusively to clubs and colleges, his latest college appearance was at Oahad University in Ruchester.

"I don't want to do bars." Ridley said. "Bars have been my bread and butter (but) clubs are ensier on you."
