Below are highlights from agendas of government meetings this week. All meetings, unless otherwise noted, are open to the public.

Farmington Hills City Council

The meeting will be cablecast live on public access channel 18.

The controversial three-member ad hoc committee will be discussed again. Residents with petitions opposing the committee also are expected. Committee chairman Jonathan Grant is expected to make a motion regarding the committee, followed by a proposed mission statement by committee member Lawrence Lichtman. Councilman Aldo Vagnozzi will propose that the committee be dissolved.

Councilwoman Nancy Bates will propose an expansion of both the parks and recreation and the planning commissions.

The following public hearings are scheduled:

- Rezoning from RA-4, one-family residential, to OS-1, office service, on the south side of Mulfordton, between Greening and Highview avenues. Proponent and owner: Marshall L. Klein; Klein & Klein Associates, Inc.

• Rezoning from B-3, general business, to LI-1, light industrial, on the east side of North Industrial Drive, north of Grand River. Proponent: Ronald Rogers, Ideal Construction Co. Owner: Paul and Martha Boraks.

• Introduction of amendment to city code prohibiting banners in any land use district and to add a definition of sign and banner.

• Introduction of amendment to city code addressing attached porches, decks and patios subject to specific restrictions.

The council is expected to adopt amended ordinances concerning liquor licenses and manhole utility structure inspections. A March 19 public hearing date will be set for the 1990-91 Community Development Block Grant program. Approval is expected on a contract to issue bonds for the Evergreen-Farmington sanitary sewer disposal system.

The consent agenda includes the adoption of a resolution supporting

the mission statement of the newly created Center for Oakland County Open Housing.

A federal grant and intermunicipal contract for the Evergreen-Farmington sanitary sewer disposal system will be considered. The council is expected to set a date for a special bond election for the sewer separation project. A contract also will be considered for an informational program for the sewer project.

Appointments will be made to the Farmington Community Library and the Farmington Historical Commission.
