## Panel probes for peace

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IN OTHER PARTS of the discussion, the panelists made the following assertions:

• Israel is not justified in occupying the West Bank and repressing the 1.5 million Palestinians who live there as cheap labor, said Abraham. Israel occupies the land because it wants the water under the West Bank and subjects Palestinians to economic colonialism.

"It's lilegal to drill a well, plant a fruit tree or go to school," he said. "Israell sodilers beat people for singing songs (considered subservisive) or wearing the PLO colories."

Petterson said. They did not negotiate for a homeland — and thus "missed opportunities" — because they were hurting and in shock, he said, "and still hoping their Arab neighbors would come to their aid. But they never did."

Young Palestinians — Ied up with the PLO and other pro-Arab groups for not being able to help them out of their squalor and misery — may turn to extremist groups unless Israel enters meaningful negotiates, said Petterson.

Peterson said he is concerned that young Palestinians in occupied terri-tories will turn to extreme violence because of the squalor they live in and the frustrations they experience almost daily.

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
