S'craft Campus Will Expand

An agreement for exchange of lands with the State Highway Department and approval for purchase of 3,692 acres from the Archdiocese of Detroit will add more than 30 acres to the Schoolcraft College campus.

That was the announcement by W. Kenneth Lindner, vice president of business affairs, to the college board after receiving the green light to buy the property in the rear of Newman House, a Catholic-operated student project, from the Catholic archdiocese.

SCHOOLCRAFT officials have been dickering with the state Highway Department for several years in an exchange of 24 acres along the eastern boundary of the college property for land adjacent to the south side of the campus.

The state needed the land for the new expressway, and Schoolcraft's negotiators indicated as long as four years ago that it could be acquired only by an exchange.

Under the terms of the agreement, the state will file condemnation proceedings against the owners of two parcels abutting the campus, and the 27 acres will be turned over to the college.

At the same time, Lindner announced that Archbishop John Cardinal Dearden had approved the sale of the 3,692 acres for \$17,575.

The trustees also gave the administration permission to complete an agreement with the City of Livonia granting an easement of 87 feet along Seven Mile Road for construction of a sanitary sewer provided the college is allowed to tie in with the sewer when completed.

College To Hire Pair Permanently

With two administrative positions still open, the Schoolcraft College Board authorized the administration to post the jobs of "community services director" and "systems analyst" for applicants with the hope that retiring President Eric Bradner and newly named President C. Nelson Grote will make selections in March.

Dr. Grote is scheduled to spend a week on the campus during the period of March 15 through March 22.

In taking its action, the board rescinded its motion of Nov. 18 which called for filling the community services director position on a temporary basis until July 1.

Now both jobs will be posted as permanent positions for each will be accepted immediately.
