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"We can't just buy narcotics on the street corner anymore," McAllen said. "It takes more effort, more time."

time."

At the same time Oakland police agencies were increasing their efforts, federal authorities were tightening U.S. borders and stepping up their part in the war on drugs, McAljen said.

BECAUSE it's more difficult to bring drugs into this country, prices have risen drastically, she said. "Consequently, the cost of doing

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business — or supporting a habit — is much higher." A kilo of cocaine contains 1,000 grams. Since getting drugs into the country became more difficult—and the risk of arrest or robbery increased — the pre-kilo cost of cocaine has jumped to \$25,000, and the per-gram cost has increased to about \$100, she said.
