

Troop 179 marks Silver Jubilee

The 50 members of Boy Scout Troop 179 are making plans for their 25th anniversary celebration to take place June 3 at its sponsoring institution, the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington Hills. Scheduled silver jubilee festivities include a picnic lunch, demonstrations on making pineapple upside-down cake in a Dutch oven, knot tying demonstrations and competitions, compass courses, and first aid exhibitions all carried out by the scouts of the troop. The grand finale will be an afternoon court of honor where the troop's newest Eagle Scout will be presented with Boy Scouting's highest honor.

Throughout the 25 years of its existence, Troop 179 has had 38 Eagle Scouts; the first two were David Zaleski and Jeff Milliken in 1972. The two who will be honored June 3 are Brad Moore and Doug Dillman of Farmington Hills. The troop has had eight Scoutmasters and more than 300 scouts between the ages of 11-17. Leaders have met at four sponsoring institutions: Longacre Elementary School, St. John's Lutheran Church, the Central Church of Christ, and the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington Hills.
