One of the oldest and largest women's organizations in the United States, the society has its national headquarters in Washington, D.C. The headquarters encompasses an entire city block.

Christian Science lecture is planned

A Christian Scientist who has lectured internationally during the past few years, Nola A. Cook of Cleveland will present a public lecture on the subject: "Prayer: The Last Resort or the First?" It will begin at 2 p.m. Saturday, April 14 in First Church of Christ, Scientist, 33325 Grand River Avenue, Farmington. The lecture is sponsored by the congregation.

"Most people, even those who don't consider themselves particularly religious, turn to prayer during a time of severe crisis, and as the last resort," said Cook. "But the Bible points to the promise that we can utilize prayer as a first resort, in dealing with every type of problem we may be faced with."

In her long experience as a public practitioner of Christian Science, the lecturer says she has seen over and over that prayer heals not only physical problems, but offers solutions to human relations challenges. She cites a number of healings from the Bible and from her own life to illustrate her points.

In her lecture Cook says she will explain what her years of service in the spiritual healing ministry have taught her about the power of prayer. She says that people often ask her, "How can you be so sure about prayer? I've prayed and my prayers have not been answered."

According to the lecturer, it was this very question that originally brought her to the study of Christian Science. In the book of James, she

found the instruction: "Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss."

To illustrate how prayer, as taught in Christian Science, affects lives, the lecturer refers to several examples that have been faced and overcome through prayer. At the lecture she says she will tell how a condition, diagnosed by physicians as terminal, was healed through reliance on spiritual means.

The members of the local Christian Science church welcome the community to attend this public lecture. There is no charge and care for small children will be provided.
