When asked about affire for child attendants, Bride's magazine gives these suggestions from Pat Kerr, a bridat gown designer in Memphis, Tenn:

Children's fashions should reflect the overall tone of the wedding. For a semiformal or formal wedding, a flower girl may wear a style similar to the bride's gown (with a higher back or neckline, ol course), perhaps in silk or taffeta. A junior bridesmaid might wear a dress similar to your maids' (in the same col-or but perhaps with a drop waist or other style suited to a younger figure.

For a ring bearer, consider English-style knickers of silk taffeta, with tab ties or elastic; a silk shirt with a Peter Pan collar, or an antique cotton shirt with a face collar. Older boys may wear all white or off-white; a junior groomsman, a tuxedo to match other male attendants.

Guests should heed this advice from Modern Bride magazine: "At a formal wedding, women wear street-length dresses or suits in the daytime, long, ballering, or tea-length dresses in the evening. The attire for men is coordinated to their escorts, unless otherwise stated on the invitation."
