"Mail-order businesses are an important part of our free enterprise system and most of them are scrupulously honest," Harris said. "But there's always the occasional bad apple you need to identify so you can know when to say no."

The Postal Inspection Service does no excellent jub of culling these bad apples, according to Harris. "Chances are excellent that they will be stopped. The Inspection Service brings 95 percent of those charged to justice.
