1. That the Council of the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, has tentatively declared its intention to make the following improvement: Construction of Road Improvements to be located in the City on Goldsmith (from Eight Mile Road to Northerly Turnpike).

2. That plans and specifications showing the aforesaid improvement and the location thereof and an estimate of \$21,800.00 as the cost thereof are on file with the City Clerk for public examination.

3. That the City Council has tentatively designated the following special assessment district against which the cost of 89.84% of said improvement is to be assessed, being \$19,018.00 to-wit:

4. That the City Council will meet in the City Hall, 3155 Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan, on the 14th day of May, 1990, at 7:30 o'clock, P.M., Eastern Daylight Time, to hear and consider any objections to the said improvement.

5. If the City Council approves the making of the improvements, a special assessment may be levied against properties that benefit from the improvement. Act 184 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1979, as amended, provides that the special assessment, at the behest of the City, may be levied for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll before the Michigan Tax Tribunal may acquire jurisdiction of any dispute involving the special assessment. The hearing for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll will be held, if at all, at some time in the future pursuant to notice given as required by law. Appearance and protest at such hearing is required in order to appeal the amount of the special assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal. An owner of or party in interest in property to be assessed, or his or her agent, may appear in person to protest the special assessment, or may protest the special assessment by letter filed with the City Clerk at or prior to the time of the hearing, in which case appearance in person is not required.

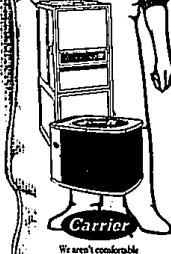
