The Russians also are beginning to pay more attention to ecological concerns and to quality of life issues, which have been animating American debate for years.

An exhibition of photos and drawings of recent building projects in both countries discloses a startling similarity, despite the vastiy different systems of building public construction in the Soviet Union and private development in the United States.

"The exhibit has two goals; to see what each country is doing and to

consider the social role of architecture." Ticlan Papachriston said at the opening. "It was not a beauty contest or a competition." Papachriston is exhibit chairman and a member of the Architects, Designers and Planners for Social Responsibility (ADPSR) headquartered in New York. The show is also supported by the Union of Architects in the U.S.R.

EACH COUNTRY selected 31 projects from an original pool of 100 entries for the exhibit at Knoll Design Center in New York City's Solio

area through the end of May.
