

Student at OU reports rape

An Oakland University female student last week told campus police she was raped May 10 after returning to her car from a night class.

The 19-year-old student said a man, hiding in her car when she got in it about 10 p.m., forced her to drive to the secluded south central end of campus where he raped her and then fled, according to a university press release.

She told campus police she was too frightened to report the incident earlier.

Public Safety Director Dick Leonard said police are investigating the incident "vigorously."
