Zoning Text Amendment 12, 1990

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Farmington Hills City Council will give formal consideration to a proposed text amendment of the Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, which amendment will amend Section 34-553. A summary of said amendment is as follows:

The proposed Text change will amend the Tree Protection, removal and replacement standards and requirements.
1. Revise Section 34-553 (a) (1) c. to read as follows:
Evergreen trees shall not be less than eight (8) feet in height. When planted in informal groupings, they shall not be spaced more than twenty (20) feet on centers within the grouping. When planted in rows, they shall be spaced not more than twelve (12) feet on centers.

2. Revise Section 34-553 (a) (1) g. to read as follows:
Large deciduous trees shall not be less than three (3) inches in caliper. When planted in informal groupings, they shall not be planted more than thirty (30) feet on centers.

3. Revise Section 34-553 (b) (2) to read as follows:
Such trees shall be of the large deciduous type, not less than three (3) inches in caliper.
