

## Adult children of alcoholics to get help in OCC program

The Community Awareness Institute of Oakland Community College will sponsor a fall forum and workshop focusing on adult children of alcoholics, featuring Patricia O'Gorman, Ph.D.

The Community Awareness Institute is a community service arm of the Mental Health/Social Work Associate Degree Program at OCC. It promotes the primary prevention of alcoholism and other social problems through education.

From 7:30-9 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 5, the program is entitled, "Discovering the Inner Child and the Higher Parent in Adult Children. It will be at the Smith Theatre at the Orc

hard Ridge Campus, 27055 Orchard Lake Road, Farmington Hills. Admission is \$10.

The program addresses the trauma that occurs frequently in alcoholic or abusive families.

From 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 6, O'Gorman will lead a workshop entitled, "Freeing the Inner Child: Self-Parenting for Adult Children," also at the Orchard Ridge Campus.

The fee for the Saturday workshop is \$45 prior to Oct. 1, and \$55 after. The fee for OCC students is \$35. Reservations are requested.

Safety belt use in Michigan has increased this year to reach the highest rate in five years, according to a study done by the University of Michigan.

Researchers at 240 Michigan intersections and freeway exits in May observed 49.6 percent of drivers and passengers wearing safety belts, an increase of 5.6 percentage points over April of the previous year, according to the study released last week.

That is the highest rate for seat belt use since July 1985, immediately after the state legislature made seat belts use mandatory for all front seat occupants, according to Fredrick M. Strell of the U-M Transportation Research Institute.

U-M researchers found the group most likely to use seat belts is youngsters under 3. More than 78 percent of youngsters in that category use seat belts. Michigan law has mandated seat belt usage for that age group since 1982.

Occupants 60 or older have the next highest rate of seat belt usage, with 59.2 percent, according to the study.

Researchers also found that seat belt usage among women is 10.3 percent higher than among men.

Seat belts could save 33 lives each year and lessen or prevent 250 serious injuries each year, according to conservative estimates, and save nearly \$84 million.
