

Rockets blast NF

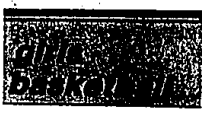
Eve Clear showed up as usual Thursday, but it was the Westland John Glenn basketball players that exploded offensively in the second half.

The Rockets led 21-20 at halftime, and then scored 47 second-half points to beat visiting North Farmington, 68-51.

The win improved Glenn to 4-5 overall and 1-0 in the Lakes Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association. North, 4-4 overall and 0-1 in the Lakes, closed to within five points during the fourth quarter but the Rockets put on a strong charge late to win convincingly.

The high-scoring Clear, who was held to seven points in the first half, finished with 23 points. Teammate Karen Sermet added 21 points.

Jennifer Massey was one of four Glenn players in double figures with 11 points, but it was her rebounding and defense on Clear that deserved the most praise from coach Pat Bennett.



"Massey guarded Clear one-on-one," Bennett said. "What helped us was we didn't double team Eve as much as we did the people who tried to get the ball to Eve. We knew Eve would get her points, but we felt our five players could get their share of points as well."

"I think our poise and control of the game near the end helped us tremendously. A couple players (Massey and Karen Olack) had three fouls each and still played intensely without fouling out."

Junior guard Carrie Rachwal led Glenn with a season-high 24 points, 17 coming in the second half. Junior forward Cathy Mruk added 13 points

and junior forward Pam Dixon contributed 10.

MERCY 68, LADYWOOD 38: Point guard Kathleen Berrigan established a new school record for assists Thursday, as Farmington Hills Mercy routed Ladywood in a game played at Redford Catholic Central.

Berrigan, a junior, scored 14 points and recorded 12 assists, one more than the Mercy record held by three players. Senior forward Carrie Walton scored 13 of her game-high 15 points after halftime as the Marlins won their eighth game in 10 outings.

Mercy is 2-1 in the Catholic League's Central Division. Ladywood, losers of six straight, fell to 2-6 overall and 0-3 in the Central Division. Mercy led 25-19 at halftime and outscored Ladywood, 19-9, in the third quarter to open up a commanding, 44-28 lead.

Goba paces Falcons

The Plymouth Salem boys' cross country team cruised to a 22-39 victory Thursday over Farmington in a Western Lakes Activities Association encounter at Oakland Community College.

The Rocks improve their record to 2-1 overall and 2-0 in the Lakes division. Farmington 18-2-3 overall and 1-1 in the division.

Farmington's Ben Goba won the race, posting a time of 16:38. He finished one minute in front of Salem's John Thomas, who took second in 17:25.

Other runners in the top 10 for Salem were: Mike Patterson, third in 17:51; Derek Cudini, fourth in 17:54; Steve Boudreau, sixth in 18:41; Jayson McDonald, seventh in 18:45; Andy Hellmeyer, eighth in 18:55; and Matt Erickson, ninth in 19:01.

Farmington had just two runners besides Goba in the top 10. Dave Clineard took fifth (18:09), while John Duff captured 10th (19:12).

SALEM EDGED Farmington 27-28 Thursday in a girls' meet at OCC.

Farmington (1-3, 0-2) boasted the top two finishers: Allison Davis in 21:29 and Jennifer Derwinski in 21:32.

Ceray Guliewicz paced Salem with a third-place finish in 21:41. Kelly Morante was fourth in 22:16 followed by Emily Farrell, fifth in 22:28; Beth Turcotte, sixth in 22:49; and Jill Casplicki, ninth in 22:49.

Other Farmington finishers in the top 10 include: Jodi VanOrd, seventh in 22:38; Michelle Casaroli, eighth in 22:44; and Sarah Urevis, 10th in 23:03.
