more arrests and raids can be expected," Dwyner said. "Our community is no different than any other community, large or small, in the tricounty area or the entire state. Under the continuately, we do have our share of users, dealers and drug-related problems."

In the last three weeks alone, the Farmington Hills police log illustrates stronger enforcement efforts.
From Oct. 9-15, for example, police arrested seven people in five incidents, and impounded four vehicles as a result. In that period police also seized cocaine, marijuana, rolling papers, pipes and drug sorcens.

That's all part of the department's user accountability program, dubbed "Do Drugs — Do Time," which began in October 1989, Since that time, through Oct. 15, a total 164 people have been arrested in 124 incidents. Police also impounded 72 whiches and began 24 forfeiture proceedings.

cocaine, marijuana methadone, heroin, valium, Xanax pills, hashluh and a varied assortment of paraphernalla. 


