

Mercy dunks Ladywood

Farmington Hills Mercy kept its unblemished swimming record in tact Tuesday, coasting past Livonia Ladywood 80-13.

The Marlins are 5-0 in dual meets while the visiting Blazers are in their first year of swimming.

Mercy faces a big challenge in its next meet, however. The Marlins swim at Ann Arbor Pioneer, the defending state champion, Thursday and expect tougher competition.

Mercy had several standout swimmers, including its divers. Amy Dombrowski and Missy Lutz finished first and second with 180.35 points and 157.70 points, respectively.
