Wakefield was released from pris-on in 1988 after sorving 10 years of a 15-year sentence for a 1976 convi-tion for conspiracy to smugle he-roin in U.S. District Court in Detroit. Reportedly Hackett added that Wakefield is an extreme danger to the community and is one of the worst drug offenders to have appeared before her.
