Nichols, 45, of Waterford Town-ship, finished fourth in the primary with 26,239 votes.

campaign from his state Senate committee.

His list of contributors includes more than 275 individuals or committees, including the Political Action Committee of the Michigan State Politee Troopers' Association, 12,000, the Dan Murphy Victory Fund (of County Executive Daniel T.) He finished second in the primary Funds (State Sen Linck Postbarmas of Linck Postbarmas of Alto), each with contributions of \$1,000, and Oakland County Sheriff is \$98,081.
