**Guinness Book of World Records awards multi-lingual Julio Iglesias**

Julio Iglesias is the only artist ever to receive the Diamond Disc Award from the Guinness Book of World Records, selling more records in more languages than anyone else. He has played to sell-out houses around the world, and now, his first full-length American TV special will premiere on HBO Saturday, Nov. 24.

The seven child actors who starred in the 1963 screen classic *The Sound of Music* have traveled to London to publicize a 25th anniversary video release of the film.

Dennis Swanson, president of ABC Sports, has been named recipient of the 1990 Graham McNamee Award, sponsored by the American Sportscasters Association. The McNamee is awarded to a former sportscaster who has achieved excellence in another area of sports, or in another field.

Charles Gibson, *Good Morning America* co-host, is going to Saudi Arabia for live Thanksgiving week broadcasts on the ABC program. The five-day trip starts Monday, Nov. 19. Gibson will broadcast from two Army camps, an Air Force base and a Marine encampment, in addition to an as-yet-unidentified Navy ship. No specific locations have been announced for security reasons.

The second annual *Grammy Legends Show*, a two-hour special recognizing country music's Johnny Cash, "Queen of Soul" Aretha Franklin, rock and video star Billy Joel and producer/composer Quincy Jones, will be taped before an audience in New York City Dec. 5 for broadcast later in December on CBS.
