Kirkland Teeple is getting more laughs from life than ever these days, even though he is performing less.

His ownership of the successful MainStreet Comedy Showease in Ann Arbor is a main reason. The dual role of comedian and entrepreneur, he explains, allows him the freedom to perform when he wants, and when he does, to perform with less pressure.

"One of the reasons I enjoy performing now so much is it's not my livelihood, it's my hobby, "said Teeple, 32, who founded the club in 1984, and will be performing there during Thanksgiving weekend.

But he also enjoys his role as businessman, perhaps even more than that of comedian.

However, the road to getting where he is today was not smooth. A native of Dearborn, Teeple got his start in comedy in 1982 by taking to the stage on open mike nights at clubs around betroit.

By 1983, he dropped out of college, quit his odd jots, packed up his navy—hue Eccort and hit the comedy club road.


