In a dog's eye

Vet removes cataracts, restores pets' vision

At age 8, Buster's career seemed over. It appeared he would have to quit his job with the fee Capades because he was losing his eyesight.
Blame it on cataracts.
Poor Buster, right?
Wrong.
Thanks to a revolutionary new surgical procedure, Buster, an 8-year-old mintature poodle, had the cataracts removed from his eyes and was back on the ice the day after he checked out of the veterinary clinic.

Buster is among the 4 dops who've been brought to Union Lake veterinarian Robert Redisch for the cataract surgery practiced by only a handful of veterinarians nationwide.

It's expensive. Try \$1,000. But when you can buy sight, hoy, that's but ask Smokey, a 12-year-old terrier mix who developed cataracts because of diabetes. Two months ago Smokey had cataracts removed from his right eye. Last week he

came back for surgery on his left

eye. Smokey had been virtually blind. He stumbled into walls. Now he can

THE NEW SURGERY, called phace-emulaification, restores a dog's vision to near perfect in most cases. It's identical to cataract sur-

cases. It's identical to exteract sur-gery for burmans.

Redisch, a 43-year-old West
Bloomfield resident, estimates the success rate at 80 percent. Some pet owners have told him that their dogs behave like pupples again when they return home.

The new technique is a marked improvement over the old method, which often lief pies with blurred vision and post-operative complications. It begins with a small incision, after which Redisch uses a small probe to break up particles in the eye.

After the particles are suctioned off, a new lens is implanted, and then timy, dissolvable sutures are used to close the incision. The surgery can take 40 minutes to three hours to complete.

Redisch first performed the surgery 14 months ago at his clinic, the Union Lake Veterinary Hospital on Cooley Lake Road, west of Hiller. He receives help from business partner Chuck Plela and other assistants.

"It's a real team effort," Redissaid.
