"We got hurt big time on the boards," Thomann said. "They've got nice sized players. They put the body on you, seal you and don't give you much room to operate."
At the other end, King's quickness and size made it difficult for Salem to make the good passes that had been a hallmark of its tournament run.

"THE PLAYS WE MADE are made to make against lesser teams we couldn't finish, because they're quicker and more athletic than those teams," Thomann said.
Salem got within 30-20 just before the intermission. But King expanded a 35-30 halftime lead by converting turnovers at the start of the third period, and the Crusaders led 49-41 at the end.
Betsy McAllister and Sarah Ruete, the only seniors on the Salem team, added nine and six points, respectively. Christy Parmuchka also scored six.
"I'm extremely proud of the team, considering how young it is," Ruete said, adding the Rocks had a senior team in 1987 when they lost to Detroit Cass Tech in the semifinals.
"We started two seniors, two juniors and one sophomore and made it this far to play against an extremely good basketball team, and I thought we played with extreme emotion and heart."

TAKE NOTICE: That the Michigan Department of Natural Resources proposes to hold a public hearing in the City of Farmington Hills, Council Chambers, 21555 Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan, at 1:30 p.m., Tuesday, the 20th day of November, 1990.
The purpose of this hearing is to secure the views of interested persons concerning the following application for permit:
Application for Permit 90-14-650 under the Inland Lakes and Streams Act (1972, P.A. 348, as amended) by the City of Farmington Hills, 21555 Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan 48302, to construct an earthen dam used as a retention structure being 200' by 75' with an 8' head. Place a 98" by 43" reinforced concrete culvert for flow through. The proposed dam will address flooding problems on the Peble Creek, Minnow Pond and the Upper River Rouge. Construct three bridges, two of which will be 40' by 10' wide and require the excavation of 1,000 cubic yards of unstable material and then fill to create approach berms, the third bridge will be 80' by 8' wide. Place fill for a new green on No. 9 line and a sand trap. The three bridges with approach berms, green and sand trap require the placement of 16,000 cubic yards of material in a floodplain adjacent to Peble Creek Drain, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan.
The application may be reviewed in the Land and Water Management Division, DNR, 2455 North Williams Lake Road, Waterford, Michigan, during normal office hours.
The hearing will be held pursuant to Section 6(3) of the cited statute. The hearing will not be a court-type proceeding; witnesses will not be sworn, and there will be no cross-examination. Public hearings are primarily informational and are held to encourage the expression of views and presentation of facts. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources will upon written request, provide a copy of the Department's decision on this application.
